

## CHOGM 2022, KIGALI, RWANDA, OFFICIAL SIDE EVENT PROGRAMME FOCUSED ON THE CALL TO ACTION ON SUSTAINABLE URBANISATION ACROSS THE COMMONWEALTH

### BACKGROUND

With 70% of global carbon emissions attributable to cities and Commonwealth countries forecast to account for nearly 50% of the growth in cities to 2050, urbanisation is a defining issue for Commonwealth leaders.

Member states, both large and small, are already facing the impacts of climate change and rapid urbanisation, while the COVID-19 pandemic has compounded these impacts, resulting in one of the worst global health and economic shocks of recent times.

Responding to these challenges, Commonwealth partners including the Association of Commonwealth Universities, the Commonwealth Association of Architects, the Commonwealth Association of Planners and the Commonwealth Local Government Forum, in collaboration with the Government of Rwanda and The Prince's Foundation, have come together to issue a Call to Action on Sustainable Urbanisation across the Commonwealth, to advance sustainable urbanisation in the Commonwealth through the Commonwealth Sustainable Cities Initiative.

The Call to Action promotes collaborative partnerships, leveraging inter-governmental, associated, and accredited Commonwealth organisations, with dedicated resources to support sustainable urbanisation that is anchored in core Commonwealth values, specifically:

- To bring a greater focus on enabling sustainable urbanisation in Commonwealth policy making,
- To develop a Commonwealth dialogue to define and implement a new way of working across our respective networks towards multi-level governance and sustainable urbanisation.
- To deliver a Commonwealth initiative of practical action to support sustainable cities and human settlements across the Commonwealth to respond to the Call to Action and to play their full role in achieving the SDGs.

### AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE SIDE EVENT

The Side Event provides an important opportunity to convene key Commonwealth stakeholders, to present the Call to Action, share good practice and explore opportunities to mobilise the Commonwealth, to identify priorities and actions to advance the Call to Action at the CHOGM and beyond. Expected outputs include:

- A shared understanding and vision for the Call to Action on Sustainable Urbanisation across the Commonwealth
- Recommendations and key messages that support the ambitions of the Call to Action
- Agreement and announcement of commitments to practical action
- The beginning of an inclusive Commonwealth dialogue towards accelerating collaborative action across the Commonwealth that addresses the sustainable urbanisation agenda.

The Side Event will directly contribute to the overarching CHOGM theme of '*Delivering a Common Future: Connecting, Innovating, Transforming*' and will complement the work being undertaken in other forums. People are at the heart of the Commonwealth agenda and this event will focus on approaches that ensure citizens are at the heart of making cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.

Recognising the reality that 60% of the Commonwealth population is under 30 there will be a particular focus on integrating the voices of young leaders and professionals into the dialogue. This interactive programme will provide a natural segue into the closing segment of the Business Forum on Thursday 23 June, which is being organised by the Rwanda Development Board, supported by the Commonwealth Enterprise & Investment Council.
